- 3. On 6<sup>th</sup> Sep, the school social workers conducted a 'survey on mental well-beings' to all S1 to S6 students.
- 4. On 10<sup>th</sup> Oct, Concordians had joined a lunchtime activity called 'Culture Awakening'. Through enjoying booth games, food, costumes, music and art work, participants have learnt about cultural diversity, enriching the campus with stronger international color.
- 5. On Oct 28<sup>th</sup>, cheering up activity was held for S6 students, hoping that they can face the public exam with courage and overcome challenges without fear.
- 6. In addition to guidance assistants, team from 'AIM' of JC A-Connect are invited to support SEN students. Individual assessments, case meetings, group training and other services etc., if needed, will be provided.

# National Education and Values Education Department (NVE) National Education

- 1. The flag raising ceremony was held in the School Opening Ceremony and on 29<sup>th</sup> September this year. It was also regularly held during the morning assembly weekly. The flag raising team marched solemnly in the hall. The ceremony came to a satisfactory close when the national anthem was played to the end. This ceremony not only raises teachers and students' awareness of civic consciousness, but more importantly, it enhances our sense of national identity.
- 2. In order to deepen teachers' and students' understanding in national policy development and the roles and responsibilities of Hong Kong in view of the development of China, a two-week morning reading sessions focusing on civic and national education was co-organized by NVE and Library in early October. Students were encouraged to read books about our home country. Most students showed enthusiasm in reading books of the related themes suggested and conducted the book sharing in the class.
- 3. NVE Department cooperates with Citizenship and Social Development/ Citizenship, Economics and Society Subject to encourage students taking part in "The 8th Bauhinia Cup Hong Kong Primary and Secondary School Students' Chinese History and Culture Knowledge Competition". Our department was responsible for the administrative work. All elite Chinese speaking students were guided to complete the online competition under the lead of subject teachers. This online competition not only enhances students' knowledge about different aspects of Hong Kong and China, but it also provides a fun way to know more about our country.
- 4. To enhance students' understanding on China, teachers in our team and student representatives had several sharing regarding National Education, which was held in the morning assembly on 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup> Sep 2025.
- 5. To increase students' understanding on national development and national security, the NVE and various subject groups will share on different national development issues and national security areas in "Speech Under the National Flag" sessions during the morning assembly.
- 6. To enable national security education to continuously take roots in schools, enhance students' understanding of the Constitution, the Basic Law and the Hong Kong National Security Law and raise their awareness of safeguarding national security as well as tie in with the Constitution Day on 4<sup>th</sup> Dec and the National Security Education Day on 15<sup>th</sup> Apr, national education and value education department invites students to participate in the "Territory-wide Inter-school National Security Knowledge Challenge" jointly organized by the Department of Justice, the EDB, the Security Bureau and Hong Kong Shine Tak Foundation. This activity is for the participation of students across the territory to create the atmosphere of safeguarding national security and synergize efforts towards safeguarding national security.
- 7. In order to increase students' understanding of China's national development and celebrate "The 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the victory in the War of Resistance against Japan", teachers from National Education and Value Education Department and Citizenship and Social Development/Citizenship, Economics and Society Subject work together on News Quiz (The 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the victory in the War of Resistance against Japan) and invite all students in the school to participate.
- 8. In order to increase students' understanding of China's national development, celebrate the National Day, and pay attention to national sports development and achievements, teachers from National Education and Value Education Department and Citizenship and Social Development/Citizenship, Economics and Society Subject work together on National Day Q&A Competition (The 15<sup>th</sup> National Games) and invite all students in the school to participate.

## **Environmental Education**

- 1. In order to raise students' awareness on school campus cleanliness and to promote the ideas of green environment, two Environment Protection Leaders shared tips about keeping the school clean in the morning assembly on 25<sup>th</sup> Sep 2025. Keeping the school campus clean is the duty of every member of the school instead of sole responsibility of the janitors.
- 2. In order to promote the concept of sustainable development and let students understand how to recycle waste more effectively and understand the concept of "Waste-to-energy", the National Education and Value Education Department participated in the upcycling workshop organized by "GREEN@WAN CHAI" at the school. All Form 2 students are invited to participate, and their finished products will be placed in the school's Recycling Centre for decoration.
- 3. National Education and Value Education Department hold a "Food Conservation and Waste Reduction" session in the OLE lesson on 22nd Oct 2025. The aim is to promote the concept of sustainable development, increase students' awareness of environmental conservation, and become global citizens with an international perspective.

## Other activities related to Values Education

- 1. A reflection on life events was conducted in the first semester with the joint effort of NVE Department and the Chinese Department. Chinese teachers chose topics which are related to students' daily life for discussion. The reflection which involves critical thinking and reasoning skills is conducive to enhancing students' sense of responsibility and understanding their roles in society. The outstanding pieces of work will be posted to the NVE bulletin board on the 5<sup>th</sup> floor.
- 2. Our department coordinates the personal goals and classroom rules setting session this year. The activity was held during the OLE period in September. Under the guidance of the homeroom teachers, the class rules and class emblem proposed were thoroughly discussed. Students comply with the classroom rules suggested by their own classes. It is expected that a harmonious learning atmosphere can be enhanced at school.
- 3. Classroom cleanliness competition has commenced since 8<sup>th</sup> Sep. Students in each class are in charge of their own class' tidiness and cleanliness. On-duty teachers and prefects of the respective floors rate cleanliness of each class. The weekly cleanliness scores are included as a proportion in the "Quality Class Competition". The classroom cleanliness scores can act as reference or indicators for homeroom teachers discussing cleanliness strategies with their own classes. Our department evaluates the overall classroom cleanliness performances each term in the morning assembly.
- 4. The morning sharing session has started in September. The morning assembly on Monday is reserved for morning devotion and Chinese cultural sharing. The Thursday sessions are reserved for book sharing or teachers' experience sharing as well as sharing or promotion from different groups. The morning assembly sessions are informative and educational. They are conducive to helping students understand local and world issues with a view to enhancing personal growth.

## 2. Individual Career and Life Planning Counseling for Secondary Six Students

Each S6 student is required to attend at least one individual counseling session in the first term (November to December) with teachers from the Careers and Life Planning team. The session intends to provide students with the chance to consult future pathways and formulate university application strategies, as well as set up their accounts on the Joint University Programmes Admissions System (JUPAS) portal. Parents of students who are not partaking in JUPAS applications will be contacted by the Team for more details. In addition, information pertaining to university admissions as well as application reminders for various programs are available to all S6 students via a dedicated Google Classroom.

#### Library

- 1. There are around 15,694 Chinese items and 7,767 English items in the library. In addition, the library has added 203 Chinese items and 160 English items, including books, newspapers, serials, and electronic resources between Jul and Oct 2025.
- 2. In 2024-2025 academic year, the library provided 142 service days (16092024-10062025) and checked out 1483 items. Each student checked out 4.83 books a year on average. S1-3 students averagely checked out 6.42 books a year while 8.23 books were checked out by S4-6 students.
- 3. All students are automatically entitled to use the loan services after 15<sup>th</sup> September. They must show a valid student identity card when borrowing materials.
- 4. The first duty day of student librarians was 18<sup>th</sup> October.
- 5. The Morning Reading Program has started since 15<sup>th</sup> Sep. There are three activities in the program, namely "Morning Reading Hall of Fame", "Theme Reading", and "Reading Sharing 1 minute". On the day of "Reading Sharing 1 minute", 5-10 students from each class will be invited for the sharing. Students who get the highest score will be recognized as "Morning Reading Star of the month". The first "Theme Reading" was held in September with the theme on "STEM/SPORTS/ART". The second Theme Reading was about "National Education" which was held in October.
- 6. The Hong Kong Public Libraries (HKPL) organises the "4 · 23 World Book Day Creative Competition" in 2026 on the theme "Blissful Moments Between Pages" in support of the World Book Day on 23<sup>rd</sup> Apr to promote a reading culture. By integrating reading and creation, the competition aims at encouraging children and young people to broaden and deepen their scope of reading, and leading them to open the door to knowledge, widen their horizons and enrich their life experience through reading. Entry Requirements: Junior Secondary (S1 S3) Chinese / English, Senior Secondary (S4 S6) Chinese / English. Submission Deadline: 6<sup>th</sup> Jan 2026.
- 7. Library will launch the "One Book Per Form" for S1 to S5 students together with the Discipline Department. The programme will help instill positive values in students.
- 8. During the morning reading period, we carry out a reading list scoring reward program, which is divided into two groups: Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary. The plan ran from Sep 2025 to October 2025. The plan in the second semester will start on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2025.
- 9. An introduction to career guidance materials, including career publications and books, electronic resources, was held with the Careers Guidance Department in Sep and Oct 2025 at the library for students of S5 and S6.

## **Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)**

- 1. CLSNP Mid-Autumn Festival Celebration
  - To cultivate students' mutual love and inclusiveness, enhance class cohesion, and promote awareness of Chinese traditional culture, the school held a "CLSNP Mid-Autumn Festival Celebration" activity on 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct. The committee members visited the school to distribute fruits to all students to enjoy together, celebrating the Mid-Autumn Festival and sharing a joyful atmosphere with their families.
- 2. The 28<sup>th</sup> Executive Committees of CLSNP Parent Teacher Association Nomination was held from 29<sup>th</sup> Sept to 13<sup>th</sup> Oct 2025 and the voting period was between 20<sup>th</sup> Oct and 27<sup>th</sup> Oct 2025. The ballot counting was conducted on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025. Different positions will be decided in the first committee meeting.
